DO YOU HAVE A LIBRARY CARD?

As a Miami Dade College student, your MDC Student ID serves as your library card. It is activated each semester when you register for class. You will need to present your MDC ID in order to access the services available in Learning Resources.

WHAT CAN YOU FIND IN THE KENDALL CAMPUS LIBRARY?

- Books, DVDs, and periodicals on a wide range of subjects that support the College curriculum.
- Reference librarians who can assist you with finding information, conducting research, using the library's resources and services, and requesting materials from other libraries.
- Course required materials placed on reserve by your instructors.
- Popular material such as best sellers, and feature films.
- Newspapers, popular magazines, and scholarly journals.
- Computer workstations, wireless Internet access, printers, copiers, scanners, laptops, tablets and collaborative space.
- Quiet study room.



COMPUTER COURTYARD

The Computer Courtyard offers a variety of technological resources and support services to students, faculty, and staff.

- PC and Mac stations, printers, headphones, laptops, tablets, fax machines, scanners, copiers and projectors.
- Assistance with basic software (Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint).

STUDENT SUPPORT LAB

The Student Support Lab, located in Room 2141, supports students' information literacy and academic skills development.

Services available include hands-on help from instructional assistants, quiet and collaborative working environments, computer stations, and other resources associated with service learning projects, Internet research, skill building workshops, etc.
